Apple Teacher Update

To support you moving forward, below is key information relating to Apple Teacher including what it is, where and how to access it and when it needs to be completed by.

Apple Teacher is a free, self-paced professional learning programme that equips educators with iPad skills and guides them to design engaging new experiences.

When do I have to complete my Apple Teacher training?

By Friday, October 21, we expect all teachers and teaching assistants in Phase 1 to have completed their Apple Teacher accreditation to enable a consistent level of proficiency for the Learning Futures inset day.

There will be time dedicated within the CPD timetable to complete the course, with an understanding that a percentage of this will be undertaken at a time of your choosing.

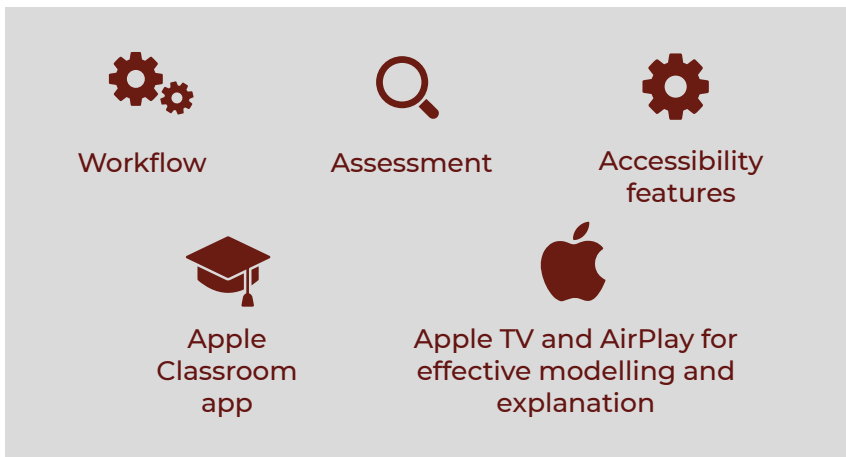

Learning Futures Inset Day

On Friday, October 21, Phase 1 and Pilot Schools will partake in the Learning Futures Inset Day. Staff members will spend the day developing their knowledge of EdTech (education technology) and how it can enhance teaching and learning.

The event will focus on the 'Top 5 for the Digital Classroom' as follows:



There will be a Learning Futures Inset Day arranged on a future date for staff in Phase 2 schools. This will provide enough time for staff to receive their iPad and complete the Apple Teacher training.

This day will be the beginning of a commitment to continuous professional development for all staff to ensure you are confident in using technology in the classroom. This will be an ongoing process and more detail will follow in due course.

Infrastructure

Computer Systems in Education (CSE) and ATLP staff have worked tirelessly over recent months to ensure Pilot and Phase 1 schools are on track.

New cabling has been laid in many schools to allow an increase in backbone speed. Switches that connect all the devices are continually being upgraded to connect systems with the internet.

Other work has included upgrading the wireless systems in eight ATLP schools and further to this, some of the local systems have been centralised and rebuilt on to the ATLP domain.

Crucially, internet speeds have been increased at all schools where possible, and a number of schools have been migrated onto the central ATLP Office 365 tenancy, to support email, Cloud storage and collaboration in support of the One Trust strategy.

Information Technology will play a vital part in the success of Learning Futures as the initiative unfolds.

The IT Strategy Group will feed information down to CSE's IT Operations Group, which feeds down to the IT Tech meetings and fuels continual improvement.
