Excited and enthusiastic children unboxed their new iPads in school before later sharing their experiences with parents at home.

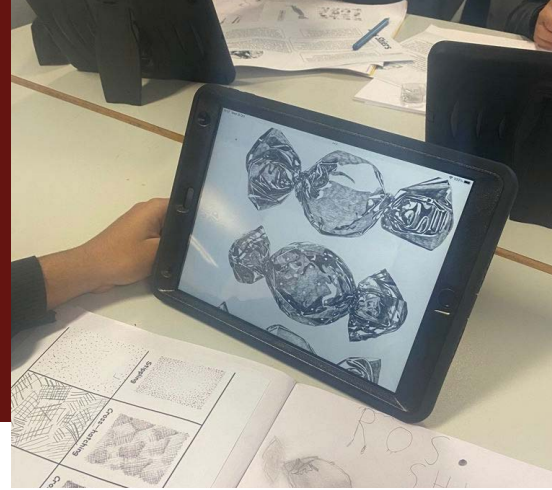
