All those participating in home testing be that staff or students are instructed in the importance of adhering to DfE/NHS guidance, with regular reminders.
	Risk of transmission of COVID-19 due to poor hygiene/ cleaning regimes	 All staff are reminded of the importance of observing strict hygiene and cleaning regimes All staff will be provided with information regarding the self-testing process before the process commences. Staff and students are regularly reminded not to attend school if they have any symptoms of COVID 19 (Continuous cough, loss of taste or smell and a high temperature) All staff will use hand sanitiser on arrival, before signing out their testing kits.

Risk of poor uptake of self-testing, non-reporting of results, or poor communication.	 DfE/NHS guidance and information for staff regarding at home self-testing is adhered to at all times. DfE/NHS guidance and information for staff is made available to staff before at home self-testing commences and regular reminders are given, with signposts to information location if staff/students wish to refresh their knowledge. DfE/NHS incident reporting information (clinical and non-clinical) is made available to all staff, to ensure that any incidents, either in school or at home, are reported promptly via the required channels.
Risk of Data Breaches/ Quality – e.g. Incorrect communication of clinical data	 Staff/parents are made aware of how results will be reported and recorded prior to at home self-testing commencing.
Travel – Risk of transmission of COVID-19 for those testing positive	 Suitable agreed procedures and advice in place for staff anyone who may test positive e.g. do not come in to work/school, self-isolate as per government guidance and arrange for a PCR test as soon as possible. If anyone staff has recently (within 90 days) had a positive PCR test for COVID-19, they are likely to have developed some immunity. Individuals are exempt from testing by both PCR and LFD within 90 days of a positive PCR test, unless they develop new symptoms.
Consent required before undertaking testing.	 Participation in the Staff will participate in the at home Self-Testing program is on a voluntary basis. Staff/Parents will be aware that written consent is not required for at home self-testing. Therefore consent is implied by attending to register and signing test kits out.
